**Richard's Ramble:** As many of you know, recently I did the coast-to-coast walk along Hadrian's Wall. I have been planning to do this for about 10 years but finally arranged it this year. A few weeks ago, I suffered some tendon / ligament damage around my left big toe and was concerned that this might cause a problem on the walk. As it happens, my toe did not hamper me, however, what did hamper me was pulling / tearing a muscle in my right leg about 20 miles into my 96 mile walk. This left me with a choice: give up or press on through the pain. I decided to press on.

Each morning, I could barely walk but as I began walking my leg muscles seemed to free up a bit. Along the walk I was in constant pain but not enough to stop me walking. This all taught me a number of lessons. Firstly, to take my mind off the pain, I recited all the verses of scripture I have ever memorised. Then I began to sing every chorus I have ever learned (it is amazing how many you can remember when you put your mind to it). The Word and Worship are foundational for enduring all that life throws at us. If the word is in us and our hearts are full of worship, we may

falter but we can stand. Secondly, I learned to take one step at a time. I knew that I could not think about the number of miles ahead as I might have given up. I just needed to concentrate on the next step in front of me.

When life causes us pain, we may not always be able to see a way through, but sometimes we just need to keep on walking, one step at a time.

## Setting the Captives Free: Notes from a Prison Chaplain

I've completed my first week as a prison chaplain. The daily duties include visiting all new admissions (approx 12 a day), everyone in segregation, vulnerable prisoners, and those leaving. It is the chaplains who break bad news to prisoners. We also run services and groups. The first thing drummed into me was to 'shoot the bolt' each time I unlock a cell (re-turn the key so the bolt shoots back out) to reduce risk of being taken hostage. I've been shooting the bolt on my mind too, to stop fears taking my mind hostage; practising what I preach about mindfulness, taking every thought captive and meditating on Scriptural truths.

It's tough working in such a place, the noise, the security, being cut off from outside, the risks; as well as learning the job and a totally different way of working. But I know it is important to take God into the place. I am praying and trusting God more than I've ever done. I was grateful He led me to Isaiah 41:10 'Do not fear, for I am with you; do not anxiously look about you, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, surely I will help you, surely I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.' The team of paid workers and volunteers are great. If you want to know what it's like watch Prisoner C4.

Please will you pray that God uses me as He wants; that I quickly learn the basics; that prisoners respond to my authority (especially that none leave cells I have opened); for wisdom about what groups to run; for Sunday services; for good team working amongst chaplains of different denominations, different faiths and other prison staff; for prisoners to receive that one touch from God they need to turn their lives around; and for the amazing volunteers.
