

One of his last prayers to the father before he died was, 'that they may be one as we are one...then the world will believe that you have sent me' (John 17:21). United acts of mission are more than just a good thing to do; they take us back to the heart of our demonstration of what Jesus came to achieve one united people of God. They are a declaration of such unity, not covering over the cracks but showing that, despite our divisions, we can work together.





These acts of witness are a long way from reuniting the church and I am not sure that will ever be achieved. However, a level of spiritual unity and common purpose achieves more than any apparent organisational unity with all its compromises. It is in such unity that 'the Lord commands the blessing, even life for evermore' (Psalm 133:3).

## Archbishop Sentamu Academy - updates.

Over recent months, the main news from us is that we have become 5 academies, grouping together in the "Sentamu Academy Learning Trust". This "Multi Academy Trust" consists of ASA, ASPIRE academy (more about that in a minute), and 3 primary academies — St. James', Newland St. John's, and Stockwell. We aim as a group to support each other, share resources, and raise standards in our respective academies far more quickly than we would be able to do alone.

One of the resources we all share is our wonderful chaplain, Anne Richards. She is delighted to be able to work across such a broad patch, and feels that she has a very sizeable parish!

Quite apart from setting up the Multi Academy Trust, we have had a very busy year. In September we opened ASPIRE – the largest "Alternative Provision" academy in the country – to cater for up to 150 young people at risk of long-term exclusion for a variety of reasons. Initially we were situated in old premises, but in January, we opened up in our new, purpose-built building. Here is a photo of part of the building, taken at the opening ceremony, led by Archbishop Sentamu himself.

We now have over 100 young people enrolled, who are making good progress in conditions to which they are far better suited. We have seen many miracles to get us to the point of being able to open ASPIRE, and we are excited about the opportunity it presents for many young lives to be turned around.

Back at ASA, in February, we welcomed the band 12/24 from the Message Trust, who came and taught RE lessons, and shared their faith with our students at a concert after school during the week. The band went down a storm with students and staff alike, and everyone is looking forward to seeing them again next year.

Our Eden team continues to work very well with a large number of our students. The team has grown to include some "Eden

associates" who now work alongside our two full-time team members — Anna and Laura. A number of our students attend "Eden Club", where they can explore their faith, and take part in a whole range of fun activities.

Last, but by no means least, we are also piloting a "Youth Alpha" course with our Y7 students, led by the chaplain and another member of staff. This is going well, and at the end of the year we will evaluate the pilot fully to see how we can best extend it.


