Richard's Ramble! By the time you read this, we will have gone to the polls regarding the European Union. Whatever the outcome of that vote, we can be sure that there are going to be difficult and challenging times ahead. Despite what the media and politicians tell us, there are no certainties on the back of this, and there will be economic and social obstructions to overcome no matter which way we jump. At such times, we need an anchor that goes beyond political rhetoric, and that has to be our faith. At the time when the New Testament was written, society was facing similar challenges. Constant power



struggles in the highest places were taking place (Caligula was murdered, Claudius may have been poisoned, Nero committing suicide, Vespasian seizing the throne by force at the end of the Year of the Four Emperors, etc.). Rome relied on grain from Egypt to sustain itself, thus exposing itself to economic vulnerability. From time to time, Barbarians at the fringes were attacking and causing fear, and rebellion inside (e.g. the Jewish Rebellion of AD68-70) meant uncertainty was all around. In addition, the church was suffering, sometimes severe, persecution. Against this backdrop, what was the response of the Apostles? The New Testament writers instruct us to live as good citizens (1 Thess. 4:1), to pray for those in authority (1 Tim. 2:1-2), to submit to secular leaders (Romans 13:1-7). This is not always, however, this is how were are called to live as citizens of a higher kingdom. How were they able to do this? Because they knew their destiny was not just about the present age but was wrapped up in the age to come. Their hope for now and the future was in Jesus. It went beyond the certainties of their own times and was set in the certainties of their present salvation and their future resurrection all guaranteed through Jesus himself. As we face an uncertain future, remember where our anchor is. It is not in the transitory reassurance of money; it is not in ambiguous relationships with family or friends; it is not in political power. It is only in Christ. God bless, *Richard*




School may be finishing for another year but we're not!

God creates our personality. Does this mean he 'predestines' people to go to hell? The answer to this question is 'it depends on your theology'. Calvinists would take the view that some are predestined for hell. Arminians,


on the other hand, would take the view that nobody is destined for either hell or heaven - it is all a freewill choice. I believe the truth (as is often the case) is somewhere in the middle. God knows the individual choices that each one of us will make. He knows in advance those who will choose to follow him, however, the choice to do so, or to reject him, is still a freewill choice or else freewill is not freewill (this is Molinism). Thus, because he knows the choices we will make he therefore has predestined us accordingly. Here the will of

God and freewill meet. The question then is, if that is the case, why are some created who do not choose him? This is a difficult question to answer in a few lines but, essentially, if free will is to operate perfectly then it must allow for either choice to be made. That also means that those who reject of a creator but people.
