
Richard's Ramble:

Setting the Captives Free: Notes from a Prison Chaplain

Last month Richard spent a day with me, doing inductions, on a segregation round and visiting men on the wings. It amused me greatly that he was dependent on me to let him out of prison. Peter S continues to come in on the first Sunday each month to lead the worship on the keyboard which goes down well. Sunday services are much improved now we've sorted microphones and speakers and we can be heard. I just need to remember not to shout into the mic

On 11th November I had the honour of leading the Remembrance service; times like this I'm overwhelmed and can't quite believe I'm doing it. I had been very anxious when preparing, but had peace in the days before, I am sure this is due to prayer. It went well. One Friday I had a temporary conversion and was a Sikh chaplain for a couple of hours...very enjoyable because I was given their festival food to eat (their Chaplain was ill and they needed a stand in).

We have just finished Louis Giglio's Goliath Must Fall Course. We had some excellent discussions on topics which challenged the men, including addiction. One interesting giant is comfort: how we think of our own comfort before God and that it is a barrier to serving God. LG said we don't challenge each other on this, which is very true. The giant in the room we all ignore and actually don't even see because it is so ingrained in us and in our culture.
