Festival of Life

Every two years, the churches of Beverley hold a Festival of Life. The purpose of this event is to reach out to the town of Beverley with the good news of Jesus Christ. It is recognised that not all churches do mission in the same way and so each church is encouraged to do a missional event(s) during the same period of time and under the same banner. It is hoped that, by so doing, the town will see the churches working together. It also provides a smorgasbord of events which will appeal to different people. Past Festivals have been modest in their success but have seen people added to the church of Beverley. This year's Festival will take place between 9th and 23rd June.

For ourselves, we have a couple of activities which will come under this banner. First, the churches will have a bus in the town centre in the first week of the mission and we will be hosting it on Tuesday 11th June. Essentially, we will be giving out tea and coffee, providing information and leaflets concerning the Festival events, and being available to talk to anyone who comes on board the bus. If anyone is free for an hour or two (and thank you to those who have already volunteered) at any time during the day, you would be welcome to join me on the bus. Secondly, we have a curry and quiz night on 22nd June at the Memorial Hall. This is an opportunity to bring the unchurched to meet BCC people in order to break down barriers. Please come, whether or not you can bring a friend, as such nights only work with a good crowd and your participation will be vital to the success of the evening.

Finally, the Festival will be 'topped and tailed' by united events. The Festival will begin with a Pentecost celebration at St Mary's at 6:30pm on 9th June at which I will be speaking. The Festival will end with a time of celebration (details still being finalised) on 23rd June.
