**Richard's Ramble:** I travelled to London recently in the midst of the Extinction Rebellion demonstrations. I never actually saw any of the demonstrators, but one of my CTE colleagues was heading on to Trafalgar Square, where the main protests were happening, after our meeting. It got me to thinking about this whole issue and what my response should be.

As many of you know, I do have serious concerns over the environmental challenges we are facing. At the beginning of the year, I turned vegan (mostly) as a personal response to the exploitative farming methods which are contributing towards the crisis. Where I have a problem with the current protests is with the word 'rebellion'. As Christians, we are called to 'submit to those in authority' (Romans 13:1) but does this extend to when their negligence is bringing humanity to a precipice? Also, while our own government may implement changes (and it is doing), until the likes of China and India get on the same page, there is little that will change overall. So I find myself in a dilemma. Do I support the current protests – I certainly support their right to make their voice heard

provided such protests are lawful – or is all of this really outside of the remit of the church?

As a creationist, I believe that we have been given the responsibility to steward the earth and that the current state of the world is a product of our greed and selfishness. Maybe my response should be to champion God's ultimate redemption which will only be brought about through Jesus Christ and his return? However you choose to respond to this situation, may God give you wisdom and bless you! God bless, Richard
