Richard's Ramble: Last week I visited the Chapel at Leconfield Army Base. In the chapel, there are some stained glass windows with various images on, but on one was St. Martin of Tours. This was a saint who had passed me by up until then, but when I was told his feast day was November 11th (my birthday) it raised my interest.

It seems that St Martin came to faith at the age of 10 but was forced to enter the Roman Army. Reluctantly he was obedient but later asked to be released by the Emperor because it was contrary to his faith. He was branded a coward but was allowed to leave and train to be a minister. A story that is associated with him is that, while he was in the army, he came across a beggar. He proceeded to tear his cloak (*capella*) in half and gave half to the beggar. That night he had a vision of Jesus wearing the torn half of his cloak and reputedly awoke the next morning to find his cloak whole again.

Whatever the truth of this story, the word for cloak means 'to cover' and it is from this word that we derive the term 'chaplain' or 'chapel'. This ministry of chaplaincy, whether to the prison, the army or in sport, is given to enable us to cover the needy with the love of God. In that sense, we are all chaplains thanks to St Martin. Setting the Captives Free: Notes from a Prison Chaplain

I continue to be allowed in and back out of prison. The work continues to be challenging with some very difficult times. There are days which go very well and this gives encouragement and a sense of purpose. We frequently have to break sad news to the men, this is difficult. They are often not able to go out to attend the funeral which is also difficult for their families. CRUSE come in to provide bereavement support but they can only see a limited number of men. I have put together a 5 week Living With Loss Course which will run October to November. Please pray that this goes well and that men are helped in the healing process.

I was signing men up for a group and looked at offences and behaviour. I wanted none of them in my group. I realised I needed to start again and just look at names. Made me grateful that God sees us, not our sins.

The 10 commandments are the topic for the Friday discussion group, and we are watching the J John series which is being well received.. Five of the men attending have just signed up for Alpha course. Numbers continue to increase in the Sunday services. Apparently seven men made commitments at the first service this month and seven signed up for Alpha.

The lack of a microphone can make the worship time challenging (obviously it is fine when I talk because I'm so loud). Peter S is going to try to sort a microphone for us which will be great. Please pray Peter's security checks are started because there are lots of delays. Please pray for safety, that the men worship without disruption, for wisdom for me on what to speak about and that the men hear God's truth and are free because of it. Please pray in particular for the November 11 Remembrance service.

Thank you that you keep in touch with me when I'm not in church on a Sunday and for all prayers and encouragement. I very much appreciate it.
