I am in the process of considering what we can offer as a church/ Restoration Centre to support people who are bereaved and grieving. Grieving is a very individual process, and can be helped or hindered by a range of things. I have increasingly become

aware of a need for more support in some areas and I think that the church and the Restoration Centre could be of real help to people - offering support and hope and compassion.

What I am thinking of are: funeral services; one to one support; a once a year Sunday morning memorial service for people to be invited to attend, to remember those who have died over the years; a scattering of ashes bespoke service.

Setting the Captives Free: Notes from a Prison Chaplain

August has seen me leading my first services in prison. Many of the men do come to worship and to listen but others come to get out of their cells and to socialise and for worse reasons.

The first service was stressful due to some disruption but the men were respectful when people were speaking from the front. The first two services of the month are free church services, then next two are Anglican. The free church services roll pretty much the same as our Sunday mornings. From September communion will be introduced into the first service of the month: the first time free churches have done this in this particular prison.

I am currently planning a bereavement course, to supplement the counselling already taking place, and two different bible study groups, and we are probably also going to be running back to back Alpha courses. We are restricted by security reasons to sizes of groups; also men cannot attend if they have jobs in the prison. (all can attend Sunday services). One man said that prison officers have been asking him why he has changed – he replied it is because of God!!!

Please pray that this spreads and that more and more men come to Sunday services and give their lives to Jesus and change as a response (we will soon have a problem of not being able to fit them in! Over the past few weeks the numbers have risen from less than 20 to 50). **Please also pray** we connect well with the officers and the governors. **Please also pray** for all of us working in a multi faith team and with different denominations of Christians, that we are humble and honour and respect each other. One volunteer said of the Catholics, Anglicans and free church volunteers that we all dance differently, but we are all dancing with Jesus. Angie.
